Roman Swindon

The range and diversity of Roman Britain hidden right beneath our feet was illustrated and described during our very successful Day School entitled 'Romans in the Borough of Swindon', which was held at the Marriott Hotel, Old Town, on March 18th.

Opened by our Patron, the Lord Lieutenant, Mrs Sarah Troughton, speakers included Melanie Pomeroy-Kellinger on recent Iron Age and Roman Archaeology in Wiltshire; Dave and Kerry Sabin on Archaeological Surveys in the area, including what can be revealed by the techniques of geophysics and airphoto analysis; Dr Pete Wilson on Excavations at Groundwell Ridge; Bryn Walters on Roman Wanborough; and Mike Stone on Roman Industry in Swindon.

110 people attended and those who attended were very complementary about the location and content.

The Marriott Hotel proved to be an excellent venue, with a good auditorium, delicious meals and refreshments and easy parking on site.

On the day we were able to promote the work of the WVCH, and receive the welcome addition of over £2,400 to funds, which was helped by generous sponsorship by the Association for Roman Archeology.

Firstly, I must start by extending many congratulations and thanks to Mike Stone for both organizing and running The Romans in the Borough of Swindon Day School held in March, which was a resounding success (see page 1).

Thanks are also due to Sue Wilthew, John Hurley and Frank Marshall, who stood down as Trustees last Autumn, for their valued support.

When the WVCH was being launched as a separate fundraising entity, John Hurley, as Secretary, and Frank Marshall, as Treasurer, were invaluable for their professional expertise and experience in easing the move away from Wiltshire Council.

Their place has been taken in part by Melissa Barnett, Curator of Chippenham Museum and Heritage Centre, who has agreed to become a Trustee. Melissa is our Volunteer Co-ordinator

and brings to the position of Trustee a wide knowledge of both the history of Chippenham and the workings of the museum world, as well as an infectious enthusiasm.

Volume XX Work in Progress

Various areas of work on the volume have made noticeable strides forward recently.

Both sections of the Religious History are now available to view on-line on the VCH web-site (www.victoriacountyhistory.ac.uk) and the Social History chapter is making good progress, so drafts of this should be also available on-line in the near future.

John Chandler, as our Consultant Editor, is drawing together and completing the work on the 'Chippenham: Introduction' chapter, whilst Professor Hoyle has made a start on the Economic History, which is on track to be completed in the summer.

The sources checklist, the definitive list of sources which need to be referenced by our historian, is scheduled to be finished this month and will then join the other sections on-line.

Volume IX Progress

Alongside Volume XX, we are now able to report that the draft for the Kilmington chapter of Volume IX has been submitted to VCH Central Office. John Chandler is finding time in his very busy schedule to continue his work on West Knoyle, before moving on to cover Mere.

Bremhill and Kington

Our two new parish groups, of Bremhill and Kington, are both keen to continue moving forward. Bremhill want to involve local people as much as possible and are looking into possible funding sources.


