Moving on to the Archive and Library, Bill Perry's tour was a tantalising glimpse of the material held at the Museum, for example, the 1628 illuminated copy of the Devizes Charter; Buckler's watercolours of Wiltshire churches and Robin Tanner's magnificent etchings of Wiltshire flora.

The pleasure of the evening was increased by the imaginative drinks and canapés with an autumnal theme served by Peter Vaughan of Vaughan's Kitchen in Devizes.

#### Chapter XX Work in Progress

The most advanced work is on 'The Established Church and Nonconformity', which be going on-line by the end of the year.

Our two Historians are to be joined by a third expert, Professor Richard Hoyle, working on the Economic History Chapter. All three are supported by John Chandler, acting as a consultant for Volume XX.

## Fundraising - Watch This Space


